C onnecticut has long been known as a leader by many economic measures, but we face critical challenges.



The state's chronic fiscal instability shakes business confidence and hinders investment; Connecticut trails most other states in growing our economy and jobs; and Connecticut is losing wealth and many educated people to other states.

Below are CBIA's policy objectives for reversing these negative trends.

On the back are recommendations to begin to achieve those objectives in 2017.

Regulatory Reform

Create systems to ensure regulations minimize costs to businesses and are adopted only if necessary to achieve the core mission of the sponsoring agency, clearly written, and interpreted reasonably and consistently.

Labor & Employment

Make it easier for businesses to create jobs by making Connecticut's labor laws and regulations more consistent with federal requirements and removing excessive administrative and legal burdens on employers.

Environment

Create a new culture of partnership and collaboration between state regulators and the business community to ensure a clean environment and a growing economy.

Sustainable State Spending & Tax Policy

Restore fiscal stability and expand economic growth and business confidence by reforming state government, reducing the cost of services, stabilizing longterm state finances, and adopting tax policies that encourage privatesector investment. Energy

Create a competitive energy future with diverse fuel sources, lower energy costs, superior infrastructure, and advanced technologies.

Education & Workforce Development

Strengthen the talent pipeline to provide more opportunities for residents and meet the skilled workforce needs of the state's employers.

Transportation

Dedicate public and private resources to priority projects that will ease congestion and improve infrastructure connectivity.

Healthcare

Shape healthcare policy using innovative best practices that reduce costs and increase quality and access.

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• ne of the most important things lawmakers can do in 2017 is promote economic growth and fiscal stability. For starters, that means not proposing bills that add more labor or other workplace mandates that would increase the high costs and heavy regulatory burdens our businesses already face.
